The "Holy Scriptures", "the Scriptures" commonly called "the Bible" derives its name from the Greek word "Biblia" meaning "book" or "Biblio" meaning "books". And this is derived from the word "papyrus" which is the name of a plant used for writing.

#### I. The Bible, God's Revelation to man.

Books reveal the identity of the writer, so books written by men reveal the thoughts of man's finite mind, but the Bible is God's revelation of Himself to man. The Bible has an answer for every problem of man today be it personal, national or otherwise.

God chose to reveal Himself to man in divers ways

God is a Being that cannot be

- seen through human eyes
- felt by human touch
- understood by human knowledge
- ♦ known by human philosophic speculation, nor
- ♦ fathomed by human intellect

He is so far exalted above and beyond man in His essential Being. Therefore God has chosen to reveal Himself fully in and

through the Lord Jesus Christ – John 1:18; 14:8-9, Colossians 1:19; 2:9 And Christ Jesus is revealed through the Holy Scriptures – John 5:39.

  - It has 40 different writers from different backgrounds; some were kings, some fishermen, lawyers, priests, farmers, intellectuals etc.
  - The writing of this Book spanned about 1600 years from about 1513 BC when Moses began to write to AD 98 when John wrote Revelation.

But behind these 66 books and over 40 different writers lies a wonderful unity of purpose that defies qualification that points to the uniqueness of the Book.

## God - II

Jeremiah 10:1-16,

**INTRODUCTION**: It was the Russian Major Yuri Gagarin (who orbited the earth in 1961 in a space craft) that said "I've been to the heavens, and I did not see God!" Ten years later Yuri Gagarin died in a plane crash and by the way-that's when he saw God. There are many scientists who do not believe in the existence of God. They think that God is just a fiction – an imagination of the heart. And this is because they believe that "seeing is believing." They say they cannot believe in the existence of a God they cannot see physically or take to the laboratory to experiment. Job 11:7; 37:23

Is this true or false?

The Bible rightly declares that "A fool has said in his heart that there is no God." – Psalm 14:1

The most embarrassing thing is that many people in the church are not sure of God's existence – this is why you find many church members still engaging in sin and or looking for help everywhere and anywhere.

Last week, we discussed what we believe about the Scriptures – that it is our final authority in matters of doctrine and practice – today we are going to discuss about God.

But, before we go on, I want you to know that

- (1) No one can fully describe God
- (2) No one can fully explain God.

In this topic, we shall seek to explain briefly – God as revealed in the Holy Scriptures.

The Bible did not try to prove the existence of God, but stated it as a matter-of-fact. "In the beginning God ..." Gen. 1:1.

## 5. The Holy Trinity

**INTRODUCTION**: Let me state from the onset that I cannot answer all your questions on this subject for 2 main reasons:

- (1) God is infinite Limitless, boundless. One who cannot be fully comprehended by finite minds.
- (2) Deut. 29:29 declares that the secret things (mystery) belongs to God, and so only what is revealed to us in the scriptures can we know. So, let us discuss the things that are revealed.

#### I. WHAT DOES THE WORD 'TRINITY' MEAN?

It means that we have One God who has chosen to reveal Himself in 3 distinctive persons. It does not mean that we have three Gods.

God's Mathematics is different from ours.

Take Marriage Mathematics as example -1+1=1

A bunch of bananas

An auditorium has length, width and height. These three cannot be separated, yet they are not the same and yet there is one auditorium.

#### II. The Unity of the Godhead

Deut 6:4 – 'The LORD our God is one LORD'

Isaiah 44:6 – 'Thus saith the LORD the King of Israel, and his redeemer the LORD of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God'

I Cor 8:4 – 'an idol is nothing in the world, and that there is none other God but one.'

I Tim 2:5 – 'For there is one God,'

James 2:19 – 'there is one God'

#### III. IT IS A BIBLICAL DOCTRINE

The Bible teaches that we have One God Who revealed Himself in three distinct persons as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Father is God – Jn. 6:27

Son is God – John 1:1,2, 20:28

Spirit is God – Acts 5:3, 4

#### IV. THE PERSONS IN THE GODHEAD ARE LIMITED TO THREE

To only three Persons are the titles of Deity (God) ascribed: the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost. These three together and they alone

#### V. THE BIBLE CLEARLY TEACHES THE TRINITY

(a) **In Creation** – Gen. 1:1-3

In Heb. 11:3, II Cor. 5:7. It is declared that it is by faith that we know and see, we believe not because we can bisect, but because it is declared by the Scriptures.

My friend, we are saved by faith. Our Lord Himself in John 14:11 said even if it is difficult for you to believe this, believe Him for the works, believe Him for His saving works. He died to set you free.

INTRODUCTION: We have already gone through 4 cardinal points of our faith, now we come to the fifth, what we believe about man. Have you ever asked yourself these questions...?

- 3. What am I doing here? And
- 4. Where am I going from here?

By God's special grace and anointing, we will seek to answer these questions.

No, the word of God says:

- a. God created him- Gen 1:26-27
- b. God created him in His image- Gen 1:27
- c. Created with dust and God's breath of life- Gen 2:7
- d. Created a free moral agent- Gen 2:16-17
- e. Created perfect- Gen 1:31, Eccl 7:29
- 3. What is he doing here?

In other words, why is he created?

- For God's glory Is 43:7
- To rule for God i.e. to be God's representative here Gen 1:26-27

Has he been able to fulfil these God ordained obligations? NO, why?

4. Where is he going from here? Or what is man's destiny?

God's original destiny is for man to live in bliss eternally, but unfortunately, man in his own action changed this destiny, and we come right round to our first question- what is man?

We have already said what man was and could have been, but what is he now?

Does the story end there?

No,

Christ Jesus died to give you life, to reorder your destiny, come to him now.

- A. The fall of Man
  - -Man sold himself to satan and thereby to sin. He rejected the rulership of God and so sin ruled from Adam(Rom 5:12)
- B. God mindful of man inspite of his sin.

- C. Your destiny could be reversed
  - -By faith in the finished work of our lord Jesus Christ on calvary

## 7. SALVATION

#### A. THE FALL OF MAN

The book of Genesis is the book of beginnings. In chapter 1, we are introduced to the creation of all things including man. We see that God created man in His own image in holiness, purity and innocence God created man as a free moral agent, but by wilful disobedience, he fell into the depths of sin and transgression.

#### 1. THE ORIGINAL STATE OF MAN

- 2. Man's original nature and position.

We will note then that the creation of man in God's image is more than physical image. Since God is a Spirit, this will rather mean moral likeness of knowledge, righteousness and holiness.

As we have seen when God created man, He created him in righteousness yet man fell – Eccl. 7:29.

- 1. God's commandment to man Gen. 2:16-17
- 2. The agent of the fall Gen. 3:1.

The subtlety of Satan – Gen. 3:1.

- did not come in person/used serpent watchout Matt. 7:15
- did not come when Adam was home Couples, watchout
- presented the temptation through legal means of appetite, inclination and desire I John 2:15-16; Lk. 4:3-5; Gen. 3:6
- began the attack by casting doubt Matt. 4:3; Gen. 3:1
- attacked the weaker vessel Watch your weak points.

#### II. STEPS LEADING TO THE FALL:

- [a] Eve listened to the lies of Satan Gen. 3:1
- [b] She dialogued with Satan Gen. 3:2-5 (Never converse or argue with the devil, except as you doubt as it is written.
- [c] She looked thoughtfully at the forbidden fruit, (Flee from lustfulness II Tim. 2:22; I Thess. 5:22.
- [d] She tampered with the Word of God Comp.

Gen. 2:16,17 with 3:2,3.

- Subtracted "freely".
- Added "neither shall you touch"

- Toned down "shall surely die" to "lest ye die"
- [e] She doubted God
- [f] She desired what God had prohibited Gen. 3:6;

I John 2:15-16

[g] She became a sinner and tempter – Gen. 3:6.

#### III. THE IMMEDIATE RESULT OF THE FALL:

- 1. Adam and Eve judged and driven from God's presence Gen. 3:16-24.
- 2. The whole creation brought under the cause Gen. 3:17-18; Rm. 8:21-22.
- 3. Satan judged and cursed Gen. 3:14-15; John 16:11; 19:30; Matt. 25:41.

CONCLUSION:- Man fell from his original state of holiness to the depths of sin but with the fall God promised a Redeemer – Gen. 3:15; Lk. 19:10; Eph. 2:8-9.

#### **B. REDEMPTION – MAN'S RUIN, GOD'S REMEDY**

We have already seen how man fell from grace to grass – how Adam though created in God's image fell into sin. Thus all mankind became sinners, totally depraved and utterly void of the holiness required by God in His Word.

#### I. MAN'S RUIN:

Consequence of the fall

#### II. GOD'S REMEDY:

Every man has become guilty before God, without excuse and deserving the just judgement and condemnation of an Holy God, but God in His infinite love provided a remedy for man's sin by sending Jesus Christ to die for man.

- [1.] **The necessity of atonement** Ezek. 18:4; Lev. 17:11
- [2.] **Man's inability to redeem himself** Job. 9:30-31; Jer. 2:22; Heb. 10:4 Ps. 49:7-9.

only the perfection and sinlessness of the Lord Jesus met this requirement and satisfied the holiness of God – Lk. 23:4, 14-15, 22; Matt. 27:3-4;

- {b} **Shed blood** Lev. 17:11; Heb. 9:22; Matt. 26:28; His perfect life alone cannot save, neither His wonderful teachings, it is in His blood alone that we have complete covering and protection from the whole consequence and curse of the broken law Ex. 12:13; Eph. 1:7; Col. 1:12-14; Gal. 3:13.
- [5] Absolute security through the slain lamb.
  - {a} Complete removal of sin Is. 53:4-8; Acts 8:32-35; I John. 1:7.
  - {b} Full redemption secured I Pet. 1:18-21; 2:24.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

We have been redeemed by the blood of the Lamb to be God's peculiar possession. We now belong to God totally; we no longer belong to the world or the devil. We are redeemed. **WE CAN NOW SING WITH FANNY J. CROSBY**:

#### C. JUSTIFICATION

Justification brings the thought of a trial, and of a court, and of law – Deut. 25:1. The human judge is required to pronounce an accused justified or condemned – Is. 5:22-23.

To be justified is to be clean of a charge or accusation – It stands opposed to condemnation.

#### I. The problem of justification:

#### V. The evidence or fruit of justification:

#### **CONCLUSION:**

The sin of man demanded the severe judgement of God, but the mercy of God yearned to rescue the offender in the interests of love, and the Lord Jesus Christ volunteered to be the Man to live the perfect life according to the law, gain the righteousness, and then give it as a free gift to the believer.

#### D. REGENERATION OR THE NEW BIRTH

Regeneration is the work of the Holy Spirit in the unbeliever's heart as the result of conviction, repentance, faith and conversion.

In regeneration the penitent believer receives a new nature. This involves a moral and spiritual renewal of the will, aim and purpose of life. Through regeneration, God imparts to us His nature.

#### I. **DEFINITION:**

- New birth John. 3:3
- New creation II Cor. 5:17; Gal. 6:15.
- New person Eph. 4:24.

Regeneration is the creation by the Holy Spirit of a new life in a person called the "New Creation" or "New Man".

#### II. NECESSITY OF REGENERATION:

[1] Man's inability dictates it – Jer. 13:23; John 3:3;

Gal. 6:15.

[2] Man's depravity demands it – Jer. 17:9; Ps. 51:5;

Eph. 2:1.

[3] God's holiness deserves it – Heb. 12:14; I Pet. 1:16:

Jer. 2:22; Rm. 3:23.

The scriptures plainly teach that all need to be born again. It is not a matter of opinion or choice. Acts. 17:30.

#### III. NATURE OF REGENERATION:

- 1. [a] It is not baptism Baptism is a church ordinance signifying that one is a Christian Rm. 6:3-5.
  - [b] It is not reformation Jer. 13:23.
- 2. Regeneration is a spiritual crisis a revolution a spiritual quickening, from creation everything has brought forth "after its kind" sinners beget sinners Gen. 1:11-12; 5:1; Ps. 51:5.

We cannot alter the old nature, or reform it, or re-invigorate it, we need a new birth – the importation of a different "kind" – God's holy nature. This is a change from death to life – It is not a reformation but a spiritual resurrection.

#### IV. THE AGENTS USED IN REGENERATION:

- 1. The Word of God Jms. 1:18; I Pet. 1:23; Rom. 10:17
- 2. The Holy Spirit John 3:5-8; Titus 3:5; Eph. 5:26
- 3. Faith I John 5:2; Gal. 3:2.

#### V. THE EVIDENCE OF REGENERATION:

- 1. A righteous life I John 2:29
- 2. Holy life I John 3:9-10; 5:18 The nature of God is incompatible with sin.
- 3. Love I John. 4:7.
- 4. Overcoming life I John 5:4; Eph. 2:1-8.

The heart is changed, sin is hated, Christ is loved, the life is changed – New and holy desires spring up like a well of living water. The new life overflows in love and good works to others, John. 4:14; 7:38.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

Like the natural birth, the new birth is an event not a process, though from the first conviction of sin to regeneration may cover many days, weeks, months or even years, yet the actual birth takes place in a second, as one passes from darkness to light, death to life – John. 5:24. The person has a second birth day.

Some one has rightly said "If you are born once, you will die twice, but if you are born twice, you will die once".

#### E. REPENTANCE

1. **Definition of Repentance**:- I Sam. 7:3; Ezk. 14:6; 18:30-31; Jonah. 3:8; I Thess. 1:9; Matt. 21:28-29; Lk. 15:17-21.

Repentance basically signifies a change of mind. It consists in a radical transformation of thought, attitude, outlook and direction. It is a turning from sin unto God and His service. It is often associated with sorrow and hatred for sin and turning from it to God.

#### 2. The Importance of Repentance:

- [a] God's universal command
  - Ezk. 18:19-22; 33:11; Is. 55:7; Acts. 17:30.

It is imperative that we must preach and demand that people should repent from their sins and turn (have faith) toward God in order to escape from the judgement to come.

#### 3. Things Leading to Repentance:

- [c] Conviction of sin Acts 2:37-38.

#### 4. **Results of Repentance:**

#### 5. Evidence of Repentance:

**CONCLUSION:** The basic idea in repentance is a change in the direction of one's life – Gal. 1:13-16, 22-24. It involves a change of attitude toward God and sin; from hating God one comes to love Him, from loving sin one comes to hate it. Repentance expresses a change of feeling, not simply with regard to what sin does to man, but also what it does to God.

#### F. THE BELIEVER'S NEW IDENTITY

When a person believes on the Lord Jesus Christ as his/her Saviour and Lord, many things happen, though he may not be conscious of more than sins forgiven or peace of mind or happiness.

- {d} **Sheep** John 10:11-15; I Sam. 17:34-37; John 10:4, 27-30; Ps. 23:1-6.

This is the Bible record of what we have and what we are. But the ignorance of what God says we are is responsible for the spiritual weakness that is common among believers today. Many believers under-estimate or under-value themselves and believe that they are worth nothing and can do nothing that is good.

Follow the example of Christ, who from the beginning of His public ministry to the end of His earthly life confessed, who He is, what He is and His Mission in life no matter who believed or doubted – I Pet. 2:21; John 16:28; 8:12; 11:45, 46. No wonder He was Victorious.

What do you have in Christ? What are you in Christ? Be sure of it, and walk like Him, talk like Him, maintain who you are in Him, what you have in Him, then like Him you will be more than a conqueror".

#### G. THE DOCTRINE OF SACTIFICATION

Sanctification is a doctrine of the church in Acts 2:41-42. The Scriptures reveal that the young believers continued steadfastly in the "Apostles teachings" or doctrines.

And these "Apostles' teachings" is none other than what Christ said to the disciples in what is generally referred to as the Great Commission in Matthew 28:18-20 with special reference to verse 20"teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you".

So, sanctification is part of Christ's command to us and therefore part of the Apostles' teaching. As believers in the Lord Jesus we have been called into holiness. For the Bible declares:

"But as He which has called you in holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation, because it is written be ye holy for I am holy" 1 Pet. 1:15-16.

But, unfortunately, many of us still shiver, shudder and shrink at the message, (some even at the mention) of holiness because of the many misinterpretation of the word and many misconceptions they have heard or experienced.

Many ministers and congregations have even abandoned the message and the idea of being holy, because they think that sanctification is not attainable, that it is not possible.

We believe sanctification is not just only possible but that it is practical. Yes, you can be holy in:

Your heart

Your home

The market place

Your business

Every area of your life.

Let us now address ourselves to this doctrine of holiness in four (4) ways

- 1. The meaning of Sanctification.
- 2. The mandate to be sanctified.
- 3. The moment of Sanctification
- 4. The means of Sanctification.

#### I. The Meaning of Sanctification.

Here is a subject that is very generally misunderstood. To many of believers in the Lord Jesus, sanctification connotes the idea of "sinless perfection".

But the fact is that the word "Sanctification" never has that meaning.

Sanctification and holiness are the same thing, being translations from the same word, both the Old Testament and the New Testament.

Some people go to the extreme of saying: "I don't believe in sanctification" or "I certainly do not believe in holiness". Such expressions are the outcome of ignorance as to the meaning of the words, and this ignorance comes from the general misuse of the words "sanctification" and "holiness".

How can someone say, "I don't believe in sanctification and holiness" when the Holy Scriptures explicitly teach them. For example, 1 Cor. 1:30 says:

"But of Him are ye in Christ Jesus, Who of God is made unto us wisdom, and righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption.

Heb.12:14 also say:

"Follow peace with all men and holiness, without which no man will see the Lord. Let us seek to enter into this study as with other studies with an open mind, sincerity of purpose and without prejudice. Let us make an honest effort to find out exactly what God Himself says in His word about this subject.

The word "sanctify" and "holy" and their cognates always have two meanings.

#### 1. Set Apart:

Here it underlines holiness or sanctification in terms of position, status or relationship. This is the reason why the words are translated "cut off", "separated", "set apart for exclusive use", "dedicated", or "consecrated".

And this means a thing or person is sacred in contrast to common, profane or secular.

Sometimes the words are used of places, as

For example: Palestine as the holy land

Jerusalem as the holy city.

Neither the holy land nor the holy city has ever been sinlessly perfect; but rather they are a land and a city set apart for God and by god for special purposes.

Sometimes the words are applied:

To things "holy garment", "holy anointing oil"

To days or events such as: "holy Sabbath days" "holy feasts" etc.

To persons: God, Jesus, Holy Spirit and Angels

The meaning in all these cases is not as touching the undaunted sinlessness of God and His Angels; it is only that He and they are in a class set apart.

#### 2. Brightness:

This underlines the scripture passage that relate to condition, state or process. And this leads on especially in the NT to the thought of an inward transformation resulting in moral purity of holy, spiritual thoughts expressing themselves in an outward life of goodness and godliness.

So, a believer in the Lord Jesus is said to be sanctified or holy both positionally and practically.

#### II. The Mandate to be sanctified.

Throughout the Holy Scripture, there are dispersed commandment and injunction to be holy or sanctified.

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1 Thess. 4:3-4
Ex. 28:14
Job 7:13
Lev. 20:7; 26; 11:44-45; 19:2; John 17:17; 1Thess. 5:23; Num 11:18
1 Pet. 1:15-16
Heb. 12:14
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So, we see that it is not optional for the believer to be holy it is mandatory. We have no option. "Be ye holy for I am holy".

#### III. The Moment of Sanctification.

As we have already noted, sanctification is regarded in three ways-positional and practical – sanctification already accomplished and sanctification yet to be accomplished.

#### 1. Positional

As regards the positional, sanctification in both instantaneous and complete, accomplished

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Heb. 10:14
1 Cor. 1:2
1 Pet. 1:2
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At the time of our new birth we are set apart for God. From that moment the believer is sanctified positionally, and this position is never changed afterwards and can never be changed or reversed. God calls us saints, a sanctified person, a holy person. (1Pet. 2:9). By the will of God we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all Heb. 10:10. This makes us "saints" and "holy brethren" Phil. 1:1; Heb. 3:1

#### 2. Practical

This begins from the day of our salvation and continues progressively. We move from glory to glory (2 Cor. 3:18). The day we were born again, God put the nature of Christ Jesus in us (1 John 3:9), and this we must seek daily to work out –Phil. 2:12; 2 Pet. 1:10 and live in conformity with the seed of new life imbedded in us.

Zechariah ......(The way of Sanctification pg.11)

This is progressive, continuous until the day of death or the coming of the Lord Jesus for His own.

#### 3. Perfect –or Consummated.

This will be accomplished at the end of the road, when the process of progressive sanctification is completed.

1 John 3:1-3

This is true or sinless perfection- Eph 5:27

#### IV. The Means of Sanctification. 2 Cor. 7:1

"In the Christian fold, here are many categories of people. Concerning holiness, some people think they cannot do without struggling, striving and trying to do their best. They pray, fast, roll on the ground and put on dirty clothes. They do all sorts of things in the external to show that they are seeking holiness from the Lord.

"In another extreme are those who believe that a believer's holiness is the God's business; that the believer himself does not have to do anything. Claiming the promises or taking one's stand or resisting the devil or looking unto the Lord Jesus are none of his business. If the believer is to be holy, the lord will do everything by Himself.

The two extremes are but just the consequence of ignorance.

The work of sanctification is both God's hand and man's. So here let's see the means of sanctification.

  - ii. The invisible Church- Rev 21:27
  - iii. The Church militant- the struggling church
  - iv. The Church triumphant- the church in heaven
- II. The Foundation of the Church

The church was launched on Pentecost but we first heard about the church in Matt 16:13-14.

- a) Built on the testimony of Peter Matt 16:16-18
- b) Not built on Peter 1cor 3:11, Eph 5:25, Acts 20:28
- III. The Purpose of the Church

God's plans and purposes are steadfast (ever sure) like He had a plan and purpose for the nation of Israel, so He has for the new Israel- "the called out ones". The main purpose of the Church is "to be to the praise of the glory of His grace" Eph 1:6

❖ To be light to the world- Matt 5:16

In Acts 2:41-47; 4:32-35 we see \$ activities which the Church should engage in to fulfil its purpose of existence:

#### B. THE DEFINITION OF THE CHURCH

If you were asked to define the Church, what would have been your definition? Would you have said: "The most beautiful house around"? Or "The building where Christians meet"? – No, it is not. In Acts 8:1 the Church is described as being people which included the Apostles.

#### I. THE MEANING OF THE WORD "CHURCH"

The word "Church" is he English rendering of the Greek "Ekklesia" meaning "a called-out assembly" – the Church is the assembly of Christian – called-out of the world system, I Cor. 1:2; Therefore the word "Church" may mean any and all of the following:

- a] A group of believers (Born again Christian) gathering together in a certain place, city or area Phil. 2; Col. 4:15; Rm. 16:5; II Cor. 1:1; II Cor. 8:1; Rev. 1:4.
- b] All Christians all over the world I Cor. 15:9; Gal. 1:13
- c] All Christians of all ages, both militant and triumphant Rev. 7:9.

#### II. THE ORIGIN OF THE CHURCH.

- a] In the Old Testament, the Church was still a mystery Rom. 16:25, 26; Eph. 2:14-16, Eph. 5:32.
- b] It was founded by Christ upon Peter's confession Matt. 16:16-18; I Cor. 3:11

As already seen, the Church is the assembly of called-out ones. It is imperative to know that to be a member of this church, one has to have been called out from a life of sin, and separated unto God. Rm. 1:6-7; I Pet. 2:9.

#### C. THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH

The Church is a glorious company of redeemed people, I believe there is a reason or purpose for everything that is done, therefore when the Lord created the Church, He must have created it for a purpose – a mission, and He could not have saved this large number of people, at great expense, for no purpose. What therefore is the purpose or mission of the Church?

#### I. The Church Was Created In Order To Please The Lord And Glorify Him.

- a] In Worship Eph. 1:11, 12; Rm. 15:6; Acts. 13:1; Psalm 100; etc

- c] To challenge the wicked forces of darkness Eph. 3:10; Lk. 9:1; 10:17-19; Eph. 6:10-18; II Cor. 10:3-5.

## III. The Church Was Created In order To Be The Means By Which The Christians Are Build Up And Nurtured.

**CONCLUSION:** The question that comes to mind is: Is our Church fulfilling the purpose for which it was created?

You see, God's plan and programme for the Church is not for it to be a second-rate rubbish in the halls of government. Nor is it His purpose to right the social iniquities of our system. But rather, His purpose is for the Church to make known His wisdom – and that to the very principalities and power in the heavenlies – Eph. 3:10.

The point is that the Church is a force in the community to bring life, light and meaning, and until the Church is a life and vibrant, it is useless and has failed in the purpose of its existence.

## 9. Christian Citizenship

**INTRODUCTION**: It is sometimes alleged that Christians have dual citizenship, but the Scriptures clearly states otherwise. A person who has dual citizenship is responsible to none. But as Christians, we have dual responsibility.

As a member of this church, what citizenship do you hold? To whom do you hold allegiance? To man or to God?

## 10. STEWARDSHIP

#### Luke 16:1-13

**INTRODUCTION**: The Bible teaches us that all things are created by God, and that there is nothing that we own that is not a gift from the living God – I Cor. 4:7. Therefore, the Bible teaches that we are stewards of the things that we think we own. Who is a Steward then? A steward is something like a caretaker – or a Manager. After God had created all things, He created man in order that man might rule or have dominion – that is, rule for God or rule in the place of God. So we are stewards of all things.

We can divide there "all things" into three main categories.

- (1) Stewardship of time
- (2) Stewardship of talents
- (3) Stewardship of treasure

Let's now take them one by one, but very briefly.

A. **STEWARDSHIP OF TIME** – Ephesians 5:16

In this verse, let us notice

- (1) That time is very short
- (2) That time is very elusive
- So, we must make the best use of time

#### B. THE STEWARDSHIP OF TALENTS – Matt. 25:14-30

- (1) Stewardship of life
- (2) Stewardship of opportunity
- (3) Stewardship of gifts

There is the reward for using -v 20-23 and curse/dangers of not using /misusing -vv, 24-30

- C. **THE STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE** We have the stories of 3 rich men in the New Testament whom Our Lord condemned.
  - The Rich young ruler Mark 10:17-31
  - The Rich Man & Lazarus Lk. 16:19-31
  - The Rich Fool Luke 12:13-21

Not one of them was condemned because he was rich, but they are all condemned because of hoarding – failing to share their treasure.

So, we find that the Lord demands that we share our treasure.

Not only that, the Lord demands our tithes & offerings – Malachi 3:10

In the evening, we shall discuss the blessings that will be ours, if we give unto God.

Note everything I say prayerfully, if you have anything in the contrary or have any questions you can see me anytime. I want us to look at this subject in 3 points.

# 13. ANGELS, SATAN AND DEMONS.

#### A. THE REALITY OF ANGELS

Man is not the only intelligent created being in God's world. The Bible reveal there is another order of intelligent beings, created by God, known as Angels, who are more advanced than man, and who occupy this universe in an area we choose to call "the Spirit World" for want of a revealed place. Angels are mentioned about 108 times in the Old Testament and about 165 times in the New Testament.

The word Angels means MESSENGER.

**1.** The Creation of Angels – Gen. 1:1; Ps. 148:2, 5; Col. 1:16; Job. 38:4-7; Gen. 6:4; Job 1:6. Even though we know the angels were created by God, we do not know for sure when they were brought into existence, but we are sure that it was before Adam –Job 38:4-7.

## 2. The Classes of Angels.

- a. God Angels Matt. 25:31
  - -Cherubim Gen. 3:24; 2 Kings 19:15; Ps. 80:1; these seem to be guardian angels.
  - Seraphim Is. 6:1, 2; these may be the singers or choir of Heaven.
  - Arch Angels 1 Thess. 4:16; these are directors or leaders of companies of Angels.
  - Michael seems to be the "Director of the armies of God". Dan. 10:13; Jude 9; Rev. 12:7.

Luke 1:19, 26.

- Gabriel seems to be the "Director of heaven's messenger service". Dan. 8:16; 9:21;
- Elect Angels 1 Tim. 5:21.

It is certain that there is order and rank in the angelic Spiritual world both among God and fallen angels.

**b. Fallen Angels –** Matt. 25:41; Jude 6; 2 Pet. 2:4; Gen. 6:4; we will be discussing about Satan and the fallen Angels in later lessons.

## 3. The Characteristics of Angels.

- a. Ministering Spirits Heb. 1:14; Ps. 104:4
- **b. Invisible**, but may choose sometimes to take on physical bodies in order to be seen and deliver God's message Gen. 18:1, 2, 33; 19:1. This is unique since here we have the pre-incarnation appearance of the Lord and 2 Angels. Luke 1:11; 26-29.
- c. Angels are not bound natural laws Acts 12:7; 5:19; Judges 13:19, 20.
- **d.** Angels are wiser than men -2 Sam. 14:20.
- **e. Angels are stronger than men** Ps. 103:20; 2 Pet. 2:11; 2 Kings 19: 35; 2 Sam. 24:15, 16; Matt. 28:2-4; Rev. 20:1-3.
- **f. Angels do not marry or bear children and do not die** Matt. 22:30; Mark 12:25; Luke 20:35, 36.

**g.** Angels are innumerable – Rev. 5:11; Heb. 12:22; Matt. 26:53; 2 Kings 6:17.

Hebrews 2:6-7, declares that man was created lower than angels but Eph. 2:5-7 reveals that our Lord Jesus will raise up those who are redeemed and place them in heavenly places in Christ. What an enviable position.

As created beings, angels passes the limitations that go along with creature-hood. By this I mean that they are not self-existent, omniscient, omnipotent or omnipresent as God. Moreover, since angels are created being, they must never be worshipped. I would emphasise that again: <u>Angels</u> must never be objects of human worship - Col. 2:18; Rev. 22:8-9.

#### GOD ONLY IS WORTHY OF OUR PRAISE AND ADORATION.

#### **B. THE MINISTRY OF ANGELS**

"Angels minister to us personally. Many accounts in scripture confirm that we are the subjects of their individual concern. In his book, Table talk Martin Luther said, "An Angel is a spiritual creature created by God without a body, for the service of Christian and the church". We may not always be aware pf the presence of angels. We cant always predict how they will appear. But angels have been said to be our neighbours. Often they may be our companions without being aware of their presence. We know little of their constant ministry.

The Bible assures us, however, that one day our eyes will be unscaled to see and know the full extent of the full attention angels have given us (1 Cor. 13:11,12). Billy Graham in "Angels: secrets agents".

"Spiritual forces and resources are available to all Christians. Because our resources are unlimited, Christians will be winners. Millions of angels are at God's command and at our service. The hosts of heaven stand at attention as we make our way from earth to glory, and Satan's BB(toy) guns are no match for God's heavy artillery. So don't be afraid. God is for you". Billy Graham in Angels: God's secret agents.

But if you are yet in your sins, you have not accepted Jesus Christ as your saviour and Lord, the judgement of God is at hand. But if you can come to faith today and discover the reality of God's love and care for you as evidenced in the ministry of His angels on your behalf, ....., you would go forth in faith each day trusting God's watchcare over you.

#### C. THE MINISTRY OF ANGELS - II

In the first part of the ministry of angels, we as Christians have seen evidenced God's love and care for His own. It is both wonderful, heart-warming and inspiring to note that wherever, we are as children of the living God, we are never alone, but we are surrounded by myriads of angels. How, let us look at a few more of the ministry of angels.

## I. Towards the Lord Jesus Christ's earthly ministry.

- **a. Announced His conception** Matt. 1:20,21.
- **b. Herald His Birth** Luke 2:10-12
- c. Sustained Him Matt. 4:11; Luke 22:39-44

Yes, the angels of God are going to be busy during the end time. Much of their activity is related to the fulfilment of God's programme for the earth. It is uplifting to me to know that discouraging as things may appear at times, and hidden though God's dealing may be to human view the lord is at work. Angelic servants in heaven above on earth below, in the Lord's good time and wisdom, do his will and carry out his purposes. The forces of evil are going to be destroyed. Righteousness will triumph. And God and his people are going to be victorious (amen). For the believer, the future is as bright as the wisdom and power of God Himself (hallelujah).

Yes, the future is bright for the child of God, but extremely very terrible for those who do not know Christ Jesus and who continue in there sin. Revelation 20 is the picture of the white through judgement and conclude with revelation 20:15.

It is good for you to accept Him today (John 3:18) and you will experience forgiveness of sin and deliverance from eternal condemnation.

## D. SATAN Revelation 12:10-12a

Somebody wrote Satan is well and alive on planet earth. The Christian life is a battle against the enemy of our souls, Satan. This satan is God's enemy number one (no 1) and because God so dearly loves us and priced us, we have become satan's target, but under the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ, we are more than conquerous.

## I. He Is A Fallen Angel.

1] He is created as to his person – Col. 1:16; Ezek. 28:11-17; Isaiah. 14:12-14.

Many today ask, "who created satan", but from the forgoing we can see that God created Lucifer a perfect being, but satan's is self-made.

He is real as to his presence – John 8:44; Job. 1:6-12; Matth. 4:1-11. Many people today do not believe in a personal devil, recognising only the evil tendencies of the flesh, but from the Scriptures above we can deduce that satan is not just an influence, he is a person, possessing life, intelligence, will power and feeling – but he is a spirit-being and does not possess a human body neither tail nor horn.

Satan is mighty. He is cunning and clever, having set himself against God and His people. He will do everything in his power to hold people captive in sin, and to drag them down to the prison of eternal separation from God.

But God is Almighty. Satan was forever defeated at Calvary. Let us constantly claim victory over Satan through the Blood of Calvary. Rev. 12:11.

#### E. THE DEMONS

Belief in the existence of evil spirits has prevailed among all the known people of the world from the earliest times of which we have no knowledge. In many places they think that these spirits are the ghosts of the dead that have come back to annoy the living. Those who profess to have seen demons have seen them in human forms of various sorts; ordinarily demons are invisible spirits. The lord Jesus Christ and the new testament accepted without reservation the existence of demons; and the gospel of Mark tells many stories of the lord casting out demons. Some people question whether demons and spirits exist today. We strongly believe that they do.

#### I. Origin of demons.

Though there are various believes about the origin of demons, but we believe that demons are a class of angels that sinned alongside with Satan – Rev. 12:3, 4, 7; Isaiah 14:12-14; Matth. 12:24. And we also believe that there are two groups of demons:

- a] Those that are now tied up in chains, but will be loosed to hurt men during the tribulation and ultimately to judgement Rev. 9:1-12; II Pet. 2:4: Jude 6: Gen. 6:4.
- b] Those that are now travelling the heavens and the earth Job 1:7; Eph. 6:12.

#### **II.** The Nature of Demons.

- a] demons are spirit beings Matth. 8:16
- b] they have personalities and are represented as intelligent beings
   Mk. 5:10; Lk. 4:34; Gen. 3:1; II Cor. 11:14.
- c] they are evil Lk. 7:21; 8:2; Acts 19:12
- d] they are unclean Mk. 3:11; Acts 8:7; Rev. 16:13.
- e] powerful Lk. 8:29 they seen to have super-human strength requiring several people to hold a demon-possessed person Acts 19:13-16.
- f] Numerous Mk. 5:8, 9
- g] they are highly organised Eph. 6:12; Dan. 10:13.

#### **III.** The Activities of Demons.

- 1. they help Satan in opposing God and seeking to defeat His will Gen. 3:15; 6:4; Matth. 13:24-30.
- 2. Satan is the accuser of the brethren, Satan is limited to one place at a time, his servants (demons) are the active force that gather the information for Satan Rev. 12:10; 2:13.
- 3. they spread wrong doctrine I Tim. 4:1-3; Rev. 2:14, 20
- 4. they oppress man and seek to hinder his welfare Job 1:10-12; 2:4, 5; Luk. 13:16; Dan. 10:12-13.
- 5. they distress mankind by deranging both body and mind Luk. 13:11, 16; Mk. 5:1-5, 15.
- 6. it seems that as God has His guardian angels, so Satan has his guardian demons over nations etc. Dan. 10:13.
- 7. demons are able to leave and return to the body of a person Matth. 12:43-45.

8. Demons nevertheless accomplish God's purposes – Satan and his hosts are still subject to God – Job. 1:12; 2:6; Psalm. 78:49; I Sam. 16:14-16; I Kings 22:23; Judges 9:23.

The demons constitute a mighty force capable of wreaking havoc among individuals, families and nations: Watch out, they are dangerous, vicious and deadly. They want you under their control and they will pay any price to get you!

#### F. THE DEMONS II

In the preceding lesson we discovered the origin, the nature and the activities of demons.

### I. Forms of Demon Practice (Demonology)

- 1. Divination the ability with the aid of familiar spirits to foresee or foretell the future Lev. 20:27; Hoshea 4:12; Acts 16:16.
- 2. Necromancy telling the future by contacting the spirits of dead people I Sam. 28:8-13; II Chr. 33:6.
- 3. Magic this entails a mixture of science (astronomy, astrology) and familiar spirits Gen. 41:8; Ex. 7:11; Dan. 4:2 (4); Ezek. 21:21; Isa. 47:13.
- 4. Secretary and witch craft Deut. 18:10-13; Acts 19:18, 19.
- Demon worship Deut 32:17; Psalm 106:37; I Cor. 10:20.
   All these forms of demon practice are an abomination to the Lord and in requires the death sentence. Do not seek healing or escape from problems in mysterious ways.

# II. These four tests will assist you in the recognition of Demon Possession - I John 4:1.

- 1. Those connected with evil spirits always work in darkness John 3:19-21.
- 2. The spirits deny the personality of Satan as an evil being.
- 3. They hate the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ and the expression, 'The Blood of Christ'
- 4. They deny that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh I John 4:2, 3.

#### III. How demons Start Their work.

- a] Drugs these and strong alcoholic drinks are full of danger in that they make a person so his mind is an easy place for demons to work
   Hos. 4:11; Hab. 2:15; Prov. 23:29-35.
- b] Rebellion demons can take over a mind that turns against God
   I Sam. 15:23; 16:14.
- c] Fear the minds that are fearful easy preys for demon possession Job 3:25; 9:28.
- d] Malice hating someone without wanting to forgive is a way that

- lets demons work in a person Gen. 4:5-8.
- e] Incomplete surrender Matt. 12:43-45; (cp) John 12:6 and 13:2
- f] Continuance in sin Gal. 5:19-21; Eph. 2:2, 3.

## IV. Suggestions in casting out demons.

- 1. Resist Satan in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, it is best to use the Saviour full title.
- 2. Pray in faith believing and get as many as possible to pray with you
  - never work alone except under an extreme emergency Matt. 18:18, 19.
- 3. Fast if demons are stubborn Mk. 9:29.
- 4. Speak and sing much about the blood of Christ Rev. 12:11.
- 5. Quote or read Scripture showing that Christ triumphed over all powers of evil Matt. 28:18; Col. 1;14, 15.

## V. How to have victory over demons.

- 1. Be sure you have the right relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord Acts 16:31; Rm. 10:9; Luk. 10:20; Acts 19:13-16.
- 2. Childlike faith Luk. 10:21; Mk. 10:15; I Cor. 1:25-30
- 3. Wise as to Satan's deception as to his power and authority and our position and authority over him II Cor. 2:11; John 8:44.
- 4. Be awake and on guard as to Satan's fiery darts of evil thoughts, accusations and condemnations Eph. 8:33, 34; I John 1:7.
- 5. Use your 3-fold basis for victory
  - Sword of the Spirit Eph. 6:17; Matth. 4:1-11
  - The Blood of Jesus Christ Rev. 12:11
  - The Word of your testimony Rev. 12:11.

The doom of demons have been scaled – Matth. 8:29; 25:41.

**Conclusion:** The Christian need not worry about demons using their power on him to take over his mind. Demons can and, do work on a Christian, but their power is hold back because the Christian belongs to God. The Christian can at anytime call upon the Blood of Christ to cover him from the power and actions of demons – Rev. 12:11; Lk.10:19, 20.

#### G. THE BELIEVER AND DEMONS

We have learnt a lot in this series about satanic and demonic activities.

These should not generate fear in the life of the believer, because, the bible reveals that we are more than conquerors.

In this lesson, we want to pay particular attention to the relationship of the believer to demons in order to make us watchful, careful and restful in the finished work of the Lord Jesus Christ on Calvary.

1. Believer must not worship angels – Judges. 13:16-18; Col. 2:18; Rev. 19:10; Rev. 22:8-9. WHAT WE BELIEVE 47 | P a g e

Remember that one of Satan's object is a desire to be worshipped – Matt. 4:18; Isaiah 12:12-15.

- 2. Believers should be watchful against the devices of the devil II Cor. 2:11; II cor. 11:13-15; John 8. Satan can afflict, oppress and/or obsess a believer. We must not be deceived, satan is a liar, he can through his agents cause, accidents, disaster, sickness or death to believers. He can destabilise believer's home or cause friction even split in the church. But satan can always do this only:
  - a] as God permits Job. 1:10-12; 2:4-7; II Cor. 12:7-9.
  - b] as we open our doorways to him through ignorance, carelessness or yielding to demonic influences and infiltrations, by way of the flesh the five senses. Therefore we must be careful of what we see, hear, feel etc.

We must also be careful of an inordinate ambition for position and power especially spiritual power. We must therefore run from sin and live holy lives.

- 3. Believers are to resist the Devil James 4:7; I Pet. 5:8-9; Eph. 4:27. There are at least two ways of resisting the devil.
  - a] Know who you are. The greatest weapon against the Devil if, the truth.
    - Born of God John 1:12-13
    - Born to conquer II Tim. 1:7; I John 5:4-5
    - Has eternal life I John 5:13; Eph. 1:7
    - Has the life of Christ within Col. 1:27; I John. 3:9;

II Pet. 1:3-4

- He lives because Christ lives John 14:19
- He is a new creature II Cor. 5:17, not subject to the devil except by personal will.
- Christ indwells him I John 4:4
- He is complete in Christ Col. 2:8-10.
- b] Use the Sword of the Spirit Heb. 4:12-13
  - meditate on the Joshua 1:8; Psalm 1:2
  - understand the will of God Eph. 5:17
  - be vigilant I Pet. 5:8
  - use the sword Matth. 4:10
  - be filled with the fullness of God Eph. 3:19-20
  - do all things in His strength Phil. 4:13
  - use God's armour Eph. 6:11-18.

Remember how the Lord Jesus Christ conquered. He did not cry to His

Father, nor did He summon the angels. He resisted and use the Word – Matth 4:1-11. The sons of God are to do the same because I John 4:4. It is as much a command tom resist the devil", as to be "filled with the Spirit"

Eph. 5:10. Do not give the devil an inch in your life (Gal. 2:5), If you do he is going to go more than a mile. Know your right. Stand your ground. YOU ARE MORE THAN CONQUEROUS" Through HIM that loves us. Amen. GO AND BEGIN TO LIVE A LIFE OF VICTORY.

# B. THE LORD'S TABLE 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

Feasts are common in the Old Testament. There are basically two (2) ordinances that the Lord gave to His church in the New Testament: **Baptism** and the **Lord's Supper.** 

Last week, we looked at the significance of Baptism, today we are going to look at the Lord's Supper.

- ❖ How should we not partake at the Lord's table
- ❖ Why should we partake at the Lord's table

These three (3) sub-topics we are going to discuss as we look at:

## Partaking at the Lord's Table

So, when they came together, there was no sense of being one family in the Lord. The arrangements emphasized the divisions in the Church rather than their fellowship. No wonder Paul's scathing rebuke in verses 17 and 22.

- II. **A WORD OF REMEMBRANCE** vv. 23-26 or Why we should partake at the Lord's table
  - (a) a precious table v. 23 -
    - ❖ Instituted by the Lord Matthew 26:26-28
    - ❖ Last supper of the Lord Matthew 26:29

    - ❖ Matthew 26:26, disciples only. It is a personal calling
    - ❖ John 21:1-13 "Come and dine". It is a special calling.
  - (c) a prepared offering vv. 23-25
    - ❖ His body v. 24, Heb. 10:5-7, Isaiah 53:3-5
    - ❖ His Blood v. 25, Heb. 9:22, Eph. 1:7, Matthew 26:28
  - (d) a predicted death v. 26,
    - not an act of mourning but a living hope, which should be appreciated.
- III. **A WORD OF RESTRAINT** vv. 27-33 or how we should partake at the Lord's Table.
  - (a) it is a serious matter -v. 27
  - **(b) it is a searching matter** v. 28, Lam. 3:40, 2 Cor. 13:5, Ps. 139:23,24
  - (c) it is a severe matter vv. 29-30
    - ❖ Not discerning the Body of the Lord

- ❖ Not giving due weight to the church as the Body of Christ I Cor. 10:17
- Not giving due cognizance to the risen Lord being present in His worshipping community especially in the ordinances. Worship must be alive not just a rote.
- (d) it is a sacred matter. vv. 31-32

So, brothers and sisters, as we look forward to partaking at the Lord's table this evening, let us examine ourselves – mind, soul and body.

#### Remember:

- ❖ that what disqualifies you from His table here, will debar you from His table yonder, when He gathers with His Saints in the clouds
- that He may even come before evening how happy we will be!

So, are you prepared –washed and saved through His shed blood?

Are you preparing by keeping your clothes unspotted from the world?

Are you serving Him faithfully in His vineyard?
